The new Christmas decorations allowed us to create a Santa's Grotto on the deck at Alex Scott and Sons, who straight away said yes when we asked if we could take over their deck and then store the decorations for the year in their storeroom, your constant support for the work the Community Association and other community groups in Glengarry do is appreciated.



In January my family and I saw the strength and support of our community first-hand, we are still navigating our way but we will be forever grateful for everyone around us.

January also saw Glengarry Community Association volunteer Anne-Marie Dunkley acknowledged through nomination in the Latrobe City Council Australia Day Awards for her contribution to Community, and former Glengarry resident Nick King receive Latrobe City Council Citizen of the Year, congratulations to you both.

Glengarry's Ben Currie can finally call himself a champion, after taking out the British Supersport Championship.

Ben rode and raced dirt bikes from the age of eight, doing so up and down Australia at regional, state and national levels until 16 years of age.

Before an eventual move to the UK, Currie gave it a go on the tarmac, racing road bikes and his display of skill was enough to earn him the call to go to the UK.

At the flick of a switch, Currie went from living at home with his family, to pursuing a dream on the other side of the world, living alone and away from his loved ones, he found this challenge as a real learning curve.

"This is actually my 10th season in the UK, so I came over here 10 years ago as a young fella, 17-years-old, just starting the journey in the British Superbike Championship," he said.

"From Junior Superstock, I sort of just navigated my way through those first years, trying to learn my craft, keeping the dream alive.

"I managed, in my third year of trying, finished runners-up in the National Junior Superstock Championship, and then managed to progress into British Supersport (Championship), where I did a few years of that."

"I think, just never giving up and just always having the bit between the teeth to want to come back and race, not wanting to throw the towel in," Currie said.

"Last year I got signed up to go to the Supersport World Championship."

The Supersport World Championships ride in the same class as the British Supersport Championship, but ultimately is a step further, travelling the world rather than being suppressed to the UK.

"I did my debut in the World Championship, but unfortunately again I was struck with a big injury. I broke my back in Spain, in Barcelona," he said.

"Broken back, broke both of my feet, did my ACL, so I really at no

point wanted to throw in the towel and I had to prove to myself that I could do the job and pushing as hard as I can and enjoying the process.

"It has ultimately springboarded me into my best season ever after my worst season ever."

Currie entered 2023, back in the British Supersport Championship, one that he had competed in many times.

"I came back to (the UK) again, back into the trusty-old Supersport – Ducati signed me – their first year there in the championship for like 20 years," Currie explained.

"I managed to create history with (Ducati) and win their first British Supersport title," he said.

"It was really nice to finish the season with the last three races with the golden Number 1 on

the plate."

Currie got his final race win of the season during the second race at Donington Park National, to make it six wins from his last eight starts.

"The British (Supersport) Championship is the strongest championship in the world and to be able to call myself a British Supersport Champion is pretty amazing. That was the goal and I've got other goals now, I'm gonna reset and get into place and I want to go and try and achieve them," Currie said.

Currie's journey is not done yet, and although this might be the biggest achievement of his to date, he believes there is more to unlock in the coming years.

"Getting the job done is like a weight off my shoulders, like 'I've finally done it', you do question sometimes and ask 'Will I ever become champion?', but now that I've done it, it sure does feel good," he said.

"This is the top level of racing in Europe, to do this is obviously a dream come true. I've had many great moments in my career but this is the number one, this is the top of the list for sure, and I'll remember this one forever."

Thankfully the Magpies have reared their young and have stopped swooping .. that's always a challenge on the trail.

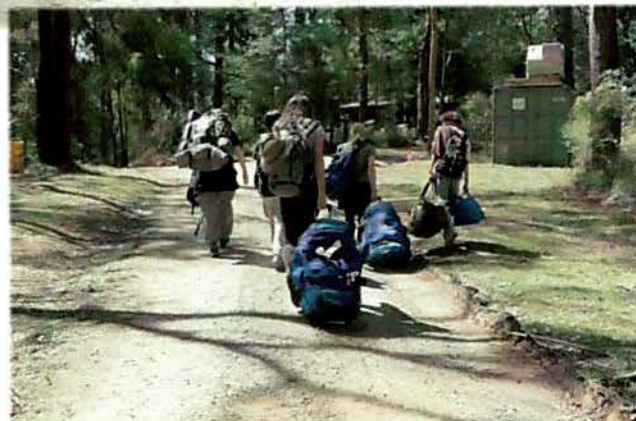

As always we are looking for new youth members to come & join in the fun & games, so why not check us out sometime.

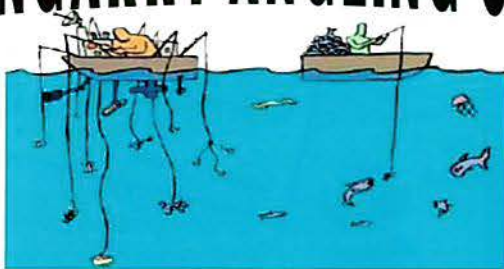

Pineapple maple-glazed ham

35m prep 1h 30m cook 15 servings

INGREDIENTS

100g brown sugar
80ml maple syrup 1 tsp Chinese five spice
5 x 440g cans pineapple slices in juice, juice reserved
7-8kg whole leg ham, on the bone
150g glace cherries 500ml water

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Preheat oven to 180C/160C fan forced. Place a large roasting pan lined with baking paper on the lowest shelf in the oven, remove the other shelves.
2. Place brown sugar, maple syrup, Chinese five spice and 125ml of reserved pineapple juice in a small saucepan. Cook over low heat, stirring, for 2-3 minutes until sugar dissolves. Bring to a gentle simmer. Simmer for 5 minutes until reduced slightly.
3. Use a small sharp knife to cut around the shank of ham in a zig-zag pattern, about 10cm from end. Carefully run knife under rind around the edge of the ham. Carefully lift off the rind in one piece by running your fingers between the rind and the fat.
4. Place pineapple rings on ham, slightly overlapping to cover, place a glace cherry in the centre of pineapple, using toothpicks to secure.
5. Pour water into prepared pan. Place the ham on a wire rack in the pan. Wrap exposed shank in foil. Brush a third of the glaze over pineapple. Bake for 40 minutes. Turn pan 180 degrees. Pour over half remaining glaze. Bake for 40 minutes until golden. Brush with remaining glaze. Set aside for 15 minutes to rest.
6. Remove toothpicks before carving.



Recipe Corner



Stained Glass Cookies

Makes: 36 (depending on size)

INGREDIENTS

3 cups plain flour $\frac{3}{4}$ tspn baking powder
 $\frac{1}{4}$ tspn salt 1 cup unsalted butter, softened
1 cup sugar 1 egg, beaten
1 tablespoon milk 2 tspns Almond Extract
Icing sugar, for rolling out the dough
Fruit-Flavored Hard Candy



INSTRUCTIONS

1. In large bowl, combine butter and sugar until light and fluffy.
2. Add milk, egg and almond extract, mix thoroughly.
3. In separate bowl, mix dry ingredients with fork.
4. Mix dry ingredients in thirds into wet ingredients bowl.
5. After adding the final portion of dry ingredients, dough is too tough for mixer - knead by hand.
6. Allow dough to chill at least an hour before working it. In humid weather the butter in the dough melts faster, causing cookies to spread during baking.
7. Roll out dough on large surface prepped with icing sugar (or flour) no smaller than 3mm thickness.
8. Punch out outside shape (largest cookie cutter), place cookies on parchment covered baking sheet. Cut enough cookies to fill sheet, cut small inside shapes from each.
9. Fill inner spaces with crushed candies. Candies will melt in oven, into very thin liquid and easily fill shapes. For large cookies place 3 candies in each middle of each.
10. Bake cookies 7-9 minutes in oven preheated to 190°C. Once edges of cookies begin to brown, remove from oven. Let cookies cool for at least 20 minutes before removing from baking sheet, store in cool dry place. Wrap for gifts.

'Kiddz in the Glen' Easy Truffles

Prep: 25 min. + chilling Cook: 5 min.
Makes about 6 dozen

INGREDIENTS

3 cups semisweet chocolate chips
1 can (400g) sweetened condensed milk
1 tablespoon vanilla extract
Toasted finely chopped nuts or assorted sprinkles

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Place chocolate chips and milk in a microwave-safe bowl; microwave on high for 3 minutes, stirring halfway through. Stir in vanilla. Refrigerate, covered, until firm enough to shape, about 3 hours.
2. Shape into 2.5cm balls; roll in nuts or sprinkles. Place in a 38x25x2.5cm pan; refrigerate until firm, about 1 hour.



3D Paper Christmas Tree Card

Materials:

1 sheet card stock (dark)
1 star sticker
8 sticker rhinestones
1 template printed on paper
(email glengarrynews1@gmail.com for templates, 5 and 6 piece templates both available) or cut:

Cut 5 squares: 12, 10, 8, 6, & 4cm or
Cut 6 squares: 13.5, 11.25, 9, 6.75, 4.5, & 2.85cm

Equipment:

Scissors Silver or gold paint pen Tacky glue

Step 1:

Print out the template onto regular printer paper. Cut out the 5 (or 6) paper squares.

Step 2:

Fold one of the paper squares in half to make a rectangle. Then fold each corner down so the edges line up at the bottom.

Repeat this folding process for each of the paper squares. You should have 5 (or 6) folded paper triangle pieces of different sizes.

Step 3:

Fold the sheet of card stock in half to make a card. Peel the backing off of the star sticker and place it near the top of the front of the card. Use a ruler to help make sure it's centered.

Add some tacky glue to the back of the smallest folded paper triangle. Center it underneath the star and press it down gently.

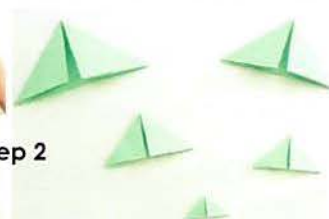
Add tacky glue to the second smallest folded triangle. Carefully place it slightly over top of the inside of the first glued down triangle and gently press down.

Repeat until you've added all of the folded triangle pieces placing them from smallest at the top to largest at the bottom.

Step 4:

Place sticker rhinestones in the sky above the paper tree. Using a gold or silver paint pen, write your message inside the card.
